How to apply

Applicants are to complete the “*UTas Gambling Research Grant Program - Grant Application Form*” and the “*Office of Research Services Submission Form*”. These forms are also available at <http://www.research.utas.edu.au/grants/index.htm> .

The completed Forms are then to be submitted to the applicant’s *Head of School*. Undergraduate and post-graduate candidates need to discuss their application with their supervisors before submitting it to the Head of School. *[Note that undergraduate and post-graduate candidates cannot be the first named Chief Investigator on an application, therefore the supervisor should be first named on the application and the ORS Submission form, and the student named second CI.]*

The Gambling Research Group, consisting of UTas academic staff from the schools of Education, Sociology and Psychology will make an initial assessment and recommend the application to DHHS for funding.

Each proposal will be assessed against the following criteria:

Track Record: (30%)

Track record relative to opportunities (15%)

Capacity to undertake the proposed research (15%)

Project Content: (70%)

Priority Area (20%)

Approach and Methods (30%)

Significance and Innovation (20%)

If the application meets the criteria, the Gambling Research Group will forward the application to the Department of Health and Human Services (via the Office of Research Services, Private Bag 01, Hobart – Attention Danielle Ryrie, Grants Officer).
